Crossroads Emergency Shelter

Crossroads Emergency Shelter provides temporary, overnight sleeping accommodations, in dorm settings; and essential services for homeless individuals, including specific populations of homeless. The initial length of stay is 30 days or less; with two 30-day extensions available for those requiring more time to secure appropriate permanent housing and or income. The Emergency Shelter meets the conditions and requirements of Ohio's Basic Standards for Emergency Shelters.

Crossroads Supportive Housing

Crossroads is a program that provides up to 24 months of transitional housing and supportive services for homeless families and individuals, with the goal of empowering them with the skills necessary to obtain and maintain independent permanent housing and to function in an independent living arrangement.

Veterans Supportive Housing

Veterans Transitional Housing is funded through the VA Grant and Per Diem program and helps homeless veterans transition to permanent housing through a supportive services and counseling strategy that integrates with existing community services. The program requires residents to take personal responsibility, to gain employment and or income, and to become self-sustaining.

Homeless Prevention/Rapid Rehousing

The Homeless Prevention/Rapid Rehousing program assists individuals or families in jeopardy of losing their housing, or assistance designed to place individuals or families exiting emergency shelter and, in rare cases transitional housing, into permanent housing. Assistance payments are given for emergency rent, mortgage, or utilities payments to prevent eviction, foreclosure, or utility shut-off. First month's rent and security deposits are available to help homeless persons establish housing. Assistance is also given in tenant landlord mediation.

Help against Homelessness

The Help against Homelessness program assists qualified individuals or families in jeopardy of losing housing in the Sandusky City tax area.

Homeward Bound

The supportive housing program represents an alternative to the current system of emergency shelter and/or transitional housings for households experiencing homelessness, by moving them directly into permanent housing and providing individualized, home-based supportive services to help each household transition to stability and independence. Homeless households are more responsive to interventions and supportive services after they are in their own housing.
